

Remembrance Sunday Activity ideas – Sawtry, Glatton and Holme 8th November 2020

You may find it useful to have some craft materials, pens and paper to hand if you would like to partake in some of these activities.

1. Write a poem inspired by Poppies. You could think about the colours, what the poppy reminds you of, what poppies mean to you.



2. Colour in the Royal British Legion Poppy Poster or decorate it using craft bits you have to hand. You could then put it up to display in a window.

3. Create an acrostic poem. This is a poem where certain letters in each line spell out a word or phrase. Typically, the first letters of each line are used to spell the message, but they can appear anywhere. Perhaps you could use 'Remember', 'Poppy', 'Hope', 'Peace' or any other word relevant to

Remembrance Sunday.

4. Play a remembering card game, you might have one already or create your own. Or you could play the remembering list game where you take it in turns to list an item and then you have to recall the items in the correct order. Often it starts with "I went to the shop and brought...."
